### **Early Career Panel**

#### **Reginald Blaze, Assurance Associate | PricewaterhouseCoopers, LLP**

Reginald attended Florida A&M University, receiving his BBA and MBA in May 2017. While attending college, he began his career at PwC as a Start Intern in 2013, and completed two more internships with the firm in 2014 and 2015. After graduation, Reginald joined PwC's core audit practice in September 2017, and is currently working towards his CPA. He has worked on audits with various clients of all sizes, ensuring the integrity and accuracy of business processes and financial statements. He has recently devoted a significant amount of time implementing the new ASC 606 guidance towards the testing of revenue processes. Reginald is active in assisting PwC with recruiting, and serves as one of the Directors for the Omega Lamplighters, a mentoring organization focused on the development of male youth.

#### **Aaron Hager, Aspire Finance Leadership Program | Baker Hughes, a GE Company**

He is a Financial Analyst employed through the Baker Hughes, a GE Company (BHGE) – ASPIRE Finance Program.
